Do they struggle to provide remote access to their users, due to a lack of technical support to manage authentication? The RemoteXS service could be of interest to you and your consortium members. RemoteXS is a cloud- based service that provides a single portal for accessing a variety of e-content, remote access authentication with one login for all content, the allocation of fixed IP addresses for institutions, and usage statistics for all e-resources. 10:10 – 10:30	Marrakesh Treaty: from policy to practise. Getting ready for the last mile (remote presentation) 31 countries have joined the Marrakesh Treaty including four EIFL partner countries. The EU will join later this year, and more are expected. Australia, Kenya and Kyrgyzstan have their legal frameworks in place to start exchange accessible format works. Libraries are key to the successful implementation. Now we need to work on providing tools to assist librarians in using the treaty to achieve the 'last mile' that is helping to end the book famine.
